I had a dishwasher fire last week. Do you have any statistics you could share about which models and brands are most likely to be a fire hazard?

RESPONSE

The information you have requested is part of our annual data returns to the Home Office Fire Prevention and Protection statistics.

The information for 2017/18 to 2021/22 is exempt under section 21 of the FOI Act because it is reasonably accessible to you and I am pleased to inform you that you can access it via the following link:

Section 21 of the Freedom of Information Act exempts disclosure of information that is reasonably accessible by other means, and the terms of the exemption mean that we do not have to consider whether or not it would be in the public interest for you to have the information.

The information for 2022/23 to date is exempt under section 22 – Information Intended for Future Publication exemption has been applied to the data thereby exempting its release. Section 22 is a qualified exemption and consideration must be given as to whether there is a public interest in providing the information prior to the anticipated publication. Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue Service is committed to recognise there is strong public interest to demonstrate openness, transparency and accountability with regards to the Freedom of Information legislation.
